Trust your instincts - protect against scams and fraud

Scams and fraud can affect everyone – there are several ways you can protect yourself from becoming a victim of these crimes, and it is important to follow new and emerging advice as these crimes become more sophisticated and harder to spot.

We encourage you to **trust your instincts**. If something feels wrong, or you receive an unexpected message – trust your instincts and double-check. We want to raise awareness of the tactics scammers use to lure you in, and to help you spot if something doesn't look, feel, sound or seem right.

"Any of us can be caught out by scammers. They deliberately target our better natures and use psychological tactics, like being overly friendly or pretending to do you a favour, making you a limited-time offer, telling you everyone else has done something or trapping you into doing little tasks for them. If you sense something's not quite right, give a clear, firm "no" - it's ok to be firm in telling scammers you are not interested." John Hayward-Cripps, CEO of Neighbourhood Watch Network.

Action Fraud and UK Finance have shared their Take Five to Stop Fraud campaign, with three simple steps to help you avoid becoming a victim of scams...

STOP: Taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.

CHALLENGE: Could it be fake? It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.

PROTECT: Contact your bank immediately if you think you've fallen for a scam and report it to Action Fraud.

This October, Oxford Neighbourhood Watch hosted a cybercrime prevention presentation, inviting local residents as well as members and volunteers to hear from their Cyberhood Watch ambassador and Neighbourhood Watch volunteer, Maggie Lewis, who shared guidance from Action Fraud and the NCSC on cybercrime and staying safe online.

The Lord Mayor of Oxford, Lubna Arshad, and Mark Godsland, Thames Valley Police and SEROCU Police Cyber Security Advisor, also visited the event, highlighting the methods criminals use to steal your data or money, and advised on how you can protect yourself against cybercrime.

Since its establishment in 2004, HertsWatch has continued to grow their membership and build a strong

Since 2006, the membership has grown from 20,000 in 2006 to over 140,000 during 2018, and then to 189,000 in 2023. An amazing achievement!

Our winter 2023 Community Grant Fund applications are open!

We're proud that much of Neighbourhood Watch's work locally is delivered by dedicated and passionate volunteers, donating their time, skills and experience to help make their communities safer, more connected and vibrant.

There are of a number of routes for seeking local funding, but when these have been exhausted or may not be relevant, we offer a **Community Grants Fund**.



Our focus is to help you kickstart, improve or expand your community work. The Trustees of Neighbourhood Watch Network set aside funds for this scheme, and this latest round opened on **Wednesday 1st November 2023**. Applications for this round will close on **1st January 2024** and be paid out in February 2024.

In the previous grant cycle, all funds were allocated to activities or one-time development initiatives that aid Neighbourhood Watch volunteers in reaching out to and interacting with vulnerable populations in their communities.

Only Neighbourhood Watch members who represent a registered and approved Neighbourhood Watch programme, group, Area, or Association in England and Wales are eligible for our funding.

Staying connected and secure - your views ERA on 'smart' homes

Thank you to the over 18,000 Neighbourhood Watch members who responded to our partner **ERA's** smart home security questionnaire. Your insights will help inform the content of future crime prevention awareness resources, as well as product research and development. Here are your highlights:

1. Smart systems

The survey showed that many of you are already connected to a broad range of digital devices and are proactively choosing smart security to protect your homes and communities.

75% of you have one or more smart device in your home. The three most popular were an Alexa, external cameras, and smart video doorbells, suggesting Neighbourhood Watch members are well-connected and open to smart technology in their home. Despite their superior intelligence and cunning abilities to stop posties in their tracks, dogs do not count as a 'smart' device, as one respondent amusingly wrote!

"I love that smart solutions can make my home appear occupied even when I'm not there. Lights and other devices can be programmed to turn on and off at specific times or controlled remotely through my smartphone" said a Neighbourhood Watch member.

"As I can monitor my cameras remotely through a smartphone app, I can keep an eye on my property wherever I am" said a Neighbourhood Watch member.

39% of members are using external cameras and **30%** have video doorbells as visible deterrents to anti-social behaviour, criminal damage and burglaries.

2. Make it simple

68% of respondents would choose to fit smart products themselves, rather than use a professional installer. More than half of you **(51%)** view ease of install as important, valuable feedback shared with ERA's product innovation team focused on creating customer-friendly smart solutions.



4. Data protection

This is an important consideration for Neighbourhood Watch members. Rest assured, ERA stores data and recordings on a UK-based cloud platform, using bank-grade 128-bit SSL data encryption, giving you peace of mind that both your property and data are secure.



Stay warm and safe this winter



As the clocks go back and temperatures drop, now's a good time to get our homes ready for winter. It's important to think about how to stay warm and protect yourself against plumbing emergencies.

WaterSafe, the UK's register of approved contractors backed by all water companies and drinking water regulators, works in partnership with the Met Office to share winter advice.



WaterSafe Director, Julie Spinks, said: "Every winter, our members see first-hand the misery burst pipes can cause. But taking these five simple steps to get ready for winter now can make a big difference when it comes to protecting your home.


Using a WaterSafe approved contractor means work will be carried out by someone who is competent and qualified."

Remember these five top tips to get ready for winter:

- 1) **Fit foam lagging on your pipes** and an insulated jacket on your outside tap to prevent the water inside freezing and bursting the pipes
- 2) Make sure you can find and use your stop tap to turn your water off in an emergency it's usually located underneath your kitchen sink
- 3) Find the number of your local WaterSafe-approved emergency plumber and save it in your phone or stick it on your fridge just in case
- 4) **Arrange a boiler service to help keep it running smoothly**, using an engineer registered with both WaterSafe and Gas Safe
- 5) **Keep an eye on your water use**; a third of energy costs come from heating water, so saving water means saving on your water and energy bills too.
